Ohio College Credit Plus

Get Both High School and College Credit for FREE

The Ohio College Credit Plus program is a popular choice for students - and for good reason. This program allows students to earn college credits while in high school, all for free. Under this program, students enroll in courses at LCCC and receive dual credit for high school requirements and for college credit. These credits may be used at LCCC or for transfer to the college or university of choice after high school graduation. Even books and other fees are covered under this state-funded program.

LCCC Credit In Escrow

Earn College Credit NOW That You Can Use Later

LCCC's Credit In Escrow program allows qualifying high school students to take college courses to receive college credit and students can choose to have college courses count toward high school graduation. Credits are then utilized at LCCC or for transfer to the college or university of choice. Under this program, tuition and all associated course costs are the responsibility of the student.

For Home-Educated Students

Students who are home educated may participate in both College Credit Plus and LCCC's Credit in Escrow program. LCCC welcomes home-educated students and, in fact, those who participate in LCCC's dual enrollment programs have proven themselves to be outstanding students.

Eligibility Requirements for College Credit Plus and Credit in Escrow Programs

Students who are currently attending chartered or non-chartered, public or private high schools, or who are home-educated, are eligible to participate in Dual Enrollment. Students currently in the sixth grade may apply now to participate for when they are seventh graders. Home-educated students may participate in LCCC's Dual Enrollment programs if they turn 12 years old before September 30 of the year they wish to enroll.

To participate in the Ohio College Credit Plus program, students need to notify their high school officials (usually a guidance counselor or principal) of their intent to participate by April 1 prior to the academic year that they wish to begin. School officials are then required to supply LCCC with the necessary academic information on students who are applying for participation. Home-educated students must submit both an intent to participate form and a copy of their college acceptance letter to the Department of Education by April 1.

Application Deadlines: For participation in College Credit Plus for fall semester, all application materials (see following information) must be received by June 15 prior to the academic year they wish to begin. For participation in College Credit Plus for spring semester, all application materials must be received by LCCC by October 15 (subject to notification of district by March 30). For the LCCC Credit In Escrow program, students need to submit application materials no later than three weeks prior to the start of the semester in which they wish to begin.

Students that are home-educated or that are attending a nonpublic high school who wish to participate in College Credit Plus must complete additional paperwork as outlined by the Ohio Department of Education. Admission and Assessment: Before final admission to College Credit Plus or Credit In Escrow, all students must complete a personal assessment process, by either completing the COMPASS exam or submitting ACT and/or SAT scores. The COMPASS (Computer-adaptive Placement Assessment and Support System) exam involves three components: an evaluation of reading, writing, and mathematical skills. The assessment takes approximately three hours to complete and may be taken in parts. Students must place at college-level in at least one of the three areas in order to be admitted to College Credit Plus or Credit in Escrow.
